SENIORS CHRISTMAS PARTY

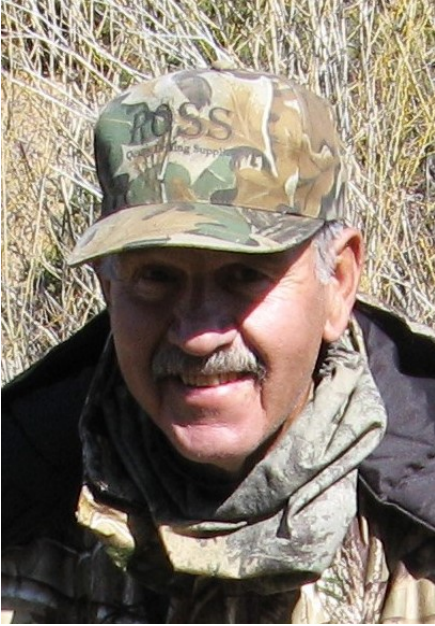

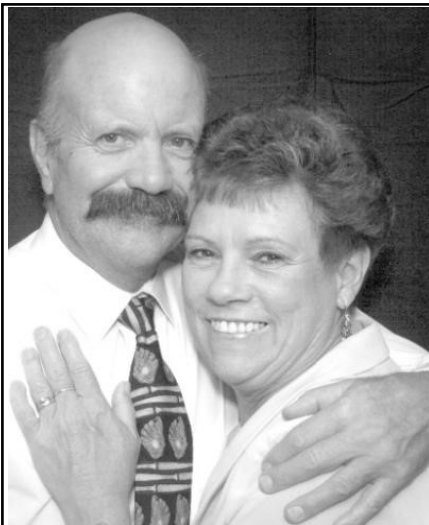
