



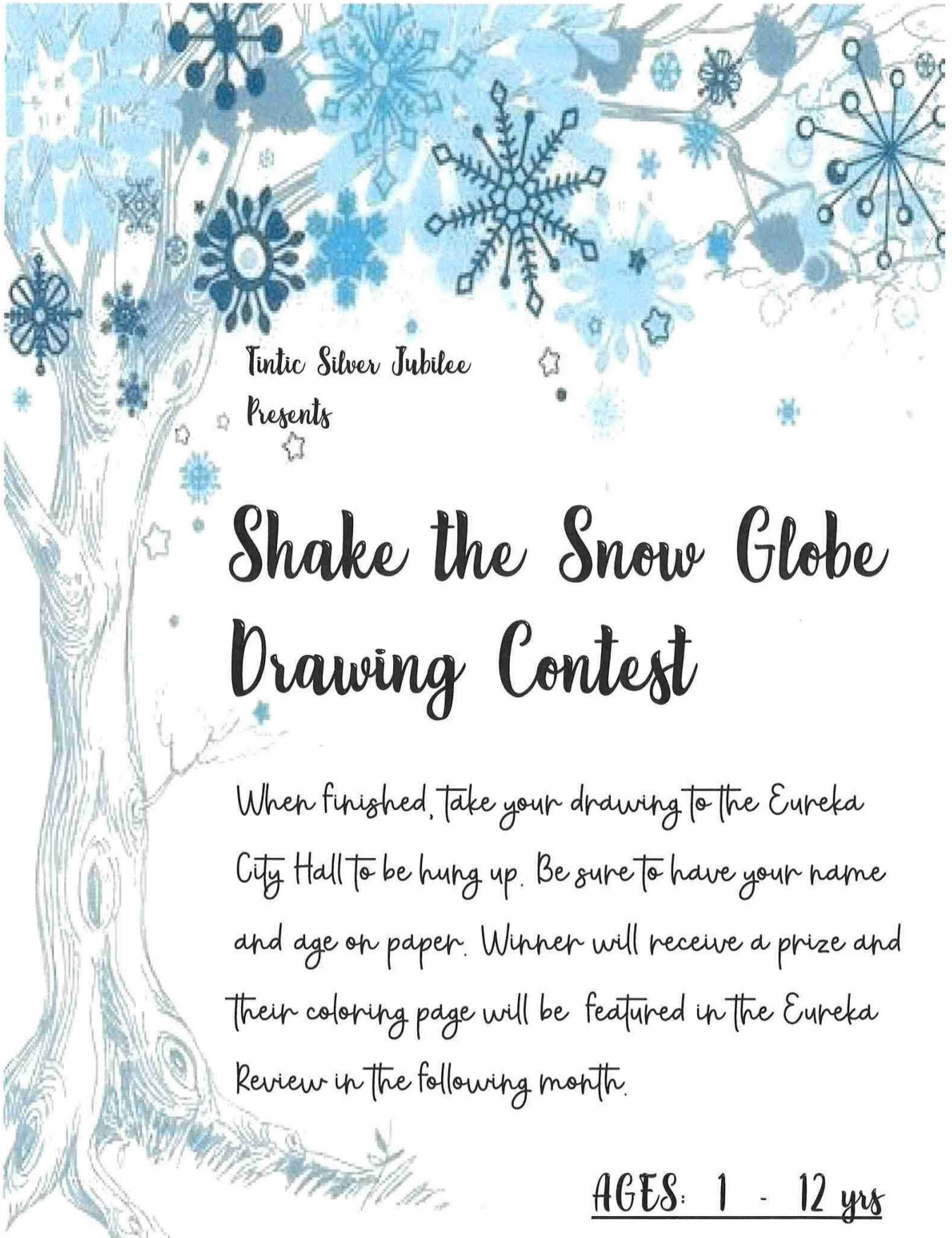

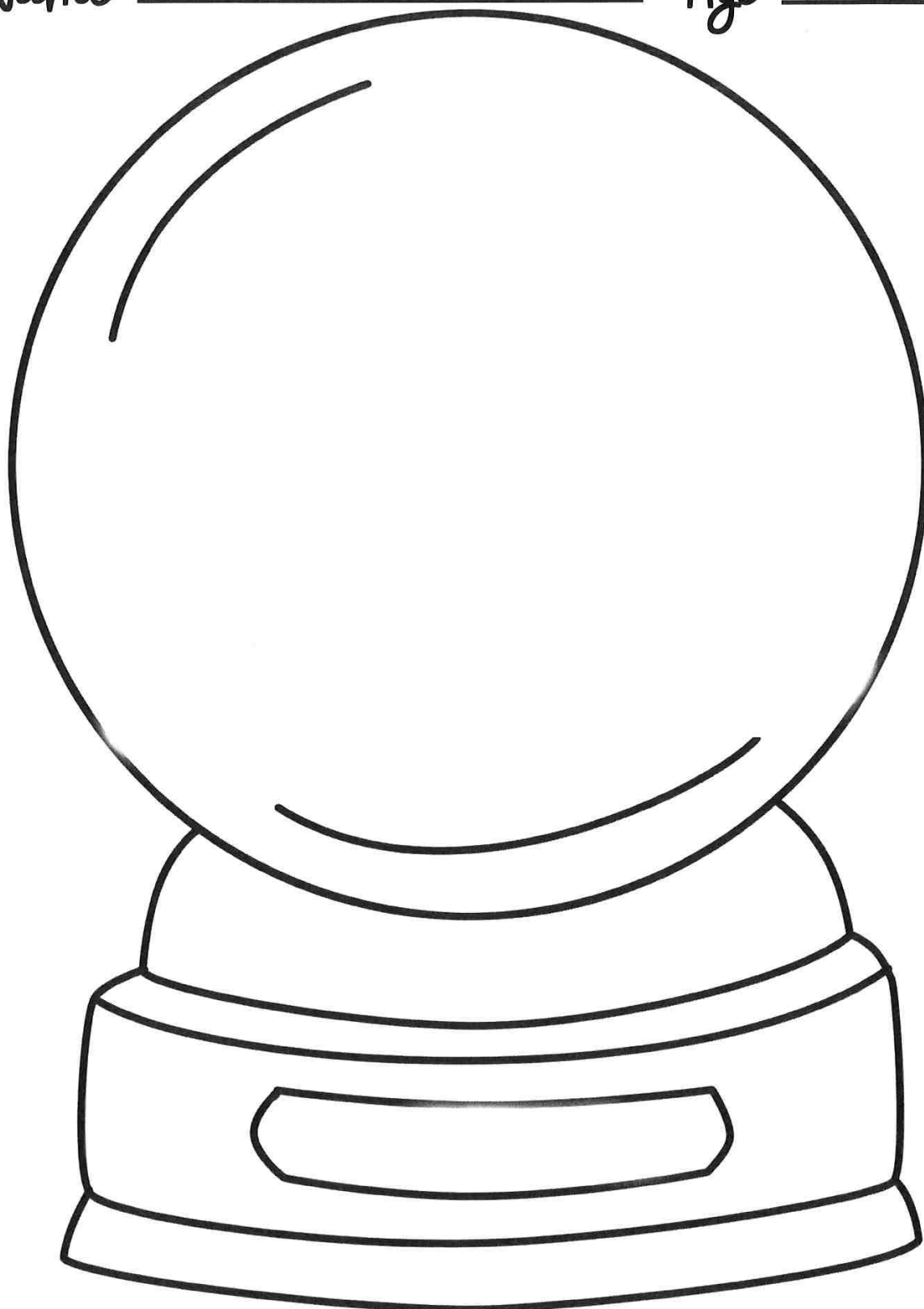

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO PREPARE REASONABLE IMPACT FEE FACILITIES PLAN AND IMPACT FEE WRITTEN ANALYSIS

Eureka City, Utah intends to commence the preparation of independent written impact fee analyses based on a reasonable facilities plan for parks, transportation, water and sewer and therefore, pursuant to the provisions of 11-36a-501 and 503 of the Utah Code known as the "Impact Fees Act", notice is hereby provided to you of the intent of Eureka City to prepare a combined facilities plan and impact fee written analysis for parks, transportation, water, and sewer. Pursuant to the Impact Fees Act, given that the City of Eureka has a population under 5,000 people, formal impact fee facilities plans are not required and instead the Town will prepare reasonable facilities plans. The plans will be prepared for one single service area encompassing the City's incorporated boundaries and proposed facilities will be located within the service area boundaries. The impact fees to be considered will be charged to new development and used to offset the cost of facilities to serve new development. Those receiving this Notice are invited to provide information to be considered in adopting the facilities plans and impact fee written analysis. ## Recipe Corner

### The Ultimate Potato Soup Recipe

Prep Time 30 minutes  
Total Time 30 minutes  
Servings 6 people  
Calories 480 kcal

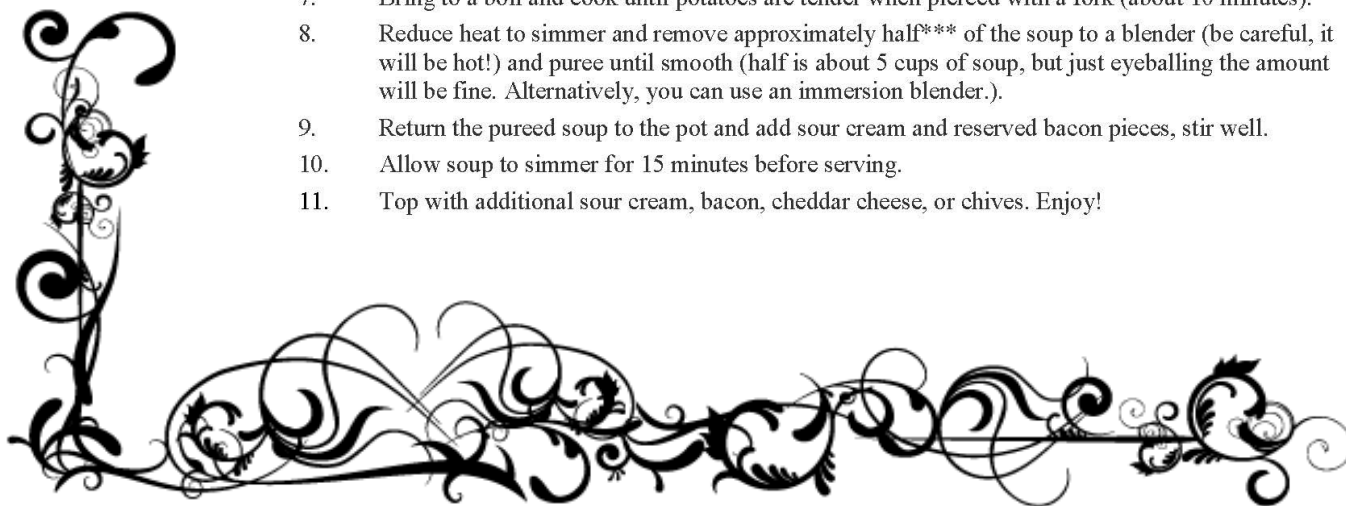


#### Ingredients

- 6 strips (uncooked) bacon cut into small pieces
- 3 Tablespoons butter unsalted or salted will work
- 1 medium yellow onion chopped (about 1.5 cup/200g)
- 3 large garlic cloves minced
- ½ cup all-purpose flour 42g
- 2 ½ lbs gold potatoes peeled and diced into pieces no larger than 1" (this was about 6 Large potatoes for me/ 1.15kg)
- 4 cups chicken broth 945ml
- 2 cups milk 475ml
- 2/3 cup heavy cream 155ml
- 1 ½ teaspoon\* salt
- 1 teaspoon ground pepper
- 1/4 - 1/2 teaspoon ancho chili powder\*\*
- 2/3 cup sour cream 160g
- Shredded cheddar cheese, chives, and additional sour cream and bacon for topping optional

#### Instructions

1. Place bacon pieces in a large Dutch Oven or soup pot over medium heat and cook until bacon is crisp and browned.
2. Remove bacon pieces and set aside, leaving the fat in the pot.
3. Add butter and chopped onion and cook over medium heat until onions are tender (3-5 minutes).
4. Add garlic and cook until fragrant (about 30 seconds).
5. Sprinkle the flour over the ingredients in the pot and stir until smooth (use whisk if needed).
6. Add diced potatoes to the pot along with chicken broth, milk, heavy cream, salt, pepper, and ancho chili powder. Stir well.
7. Bring to a boil and cook until potatoes are tender when pierced with a fork (about 10 minutes).
8. Reduce heat to simmer and remove approximately half\*\*\* of the soup to a blender (be careful, it will be hot!) and puree until smooth (half is about 5 cups of soup, but just eyeballing the amount will be fine. Alternatively, you can use an immersion blender.).
9. Return the pureed soup to the pot and add sour cream and reserved bacon pieces, stir well.
10. Allow soup to simmer for 15 minutes before serving.
11. Top with additional sour cream, bacon, cheddar cheese, or chives. Enjoy!
