DAVID FRANCIS EVANS

Five years ago, David was diagnosed with lung cancer, resulting in the removal of his right lung. After five years, the cancer returned and spread rapidly, causing him to pass away at his home on September 18, 2015.

David Francis Evans was born on August 12, 1950, in Spanish Fork, Utah, to Floyd “Flip” and Marie (Sandborn) Evans. David had one older brother, two younger brothers, and a younger sister.

David attended school in Eureka, Utah, and graduated from Tintic High School in 1968. David served as an Alter Boy at St. Patrick’s Catholic Church in Eureka. He joined the United States Marine Corps right after graduation. He served his country in the Vietnam War.

After returning from Vietnam, David went to work at the “Dragon Mine” in Eureka. He was an underground miner and worked in many mines in Colorado, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico, and Montana. Following the decline of the mining industry, David went to work as a mechanic for his Uncle Mike at Mike Evan’s Trucking in Spanish Forks, Utah.

David moved to Montana to be with his brother Steve. This is where he met his wife, Rayleen Murphy, and

they made their home. He started his own very successful business, Dave Evans Chink and Chink Repair. He worked on everything from log cabins to mansions, everywhere from Big Sky to the Tetons. David was a very hard worker, a perfectionist, and was very proud of the work he did. Although David was a man of few words, he was liked by all who met him.

David had been married twice before and had three children: Nichole, Kelly Jo, and Albert.

David is survived by the love of his life, his wife Ray; his older brother, Steve Evans of Butte; sister, Lois (Richard) Swindlehurst of Bullhead City, Arizona; three children — Nichole Evans-Brown of Detroit, Michigan; Kelly Jo Evans-Davis of Tooele, Utah; and Albert Evans of Tooele, Utah — and 10 grandchildren; and sister-in-law, Charlene McKensie, and brother-in-law, Raymond Nelson.

David was son-in-law to Raymond and Pauline Nelson and considered April (Rich) Angone like family as well as her children, Courtney and Cassidy.

Dave will be missed by all, but most especially by his dog, Princess, who never left his side.

Friends are asked to join the family on Tuesday after 12:00 p.m. (noon) in the Duggan-Dolan Mortuary Chapel. Funeral service will be conducted at 1:00 p.m. Interment of ashes will take place at a later date in the Veteran’s Cemetery at Fort Harrison, Montana.



JUAB COUNTY COLD CASES SOLVED 09/30/2015

Through DNA evidence the Juab County Sheriff’s Office has been able to close 2 unidentified body cases.

Case 1: November 1996 at Juab Lake...

A human skull and several other bones were found at Juab Lake. The bones were sent to the State Medical Examiner’s office. Recent DNA matches from samples were used to identify the victim as Rene A. Romero, a 4 year old boy from Reno Nevada. Follow-up with Reno confirmed the Rene had been murdered by his mother and stepfather on November 24, 1994. They have been prosecuted and sentenced for his murder even though the body was not identified until this DNA match.

Case 2: September 1978 at Yuba Reservoir

A female body was located at Yuba Reservoir. The body was taken to the State Medical Examiner’s officer where it was determined she died from strangulation. Her identity remained unknown until recent DNA matched a missing person report from August 22 1978 in Long Beach California. California authorities have been notified and have re-opened the case on the now identified Marilee Bruszer, who was 33 years old at the time of her disappearance. California authorities are now investigating the case as a homicide.

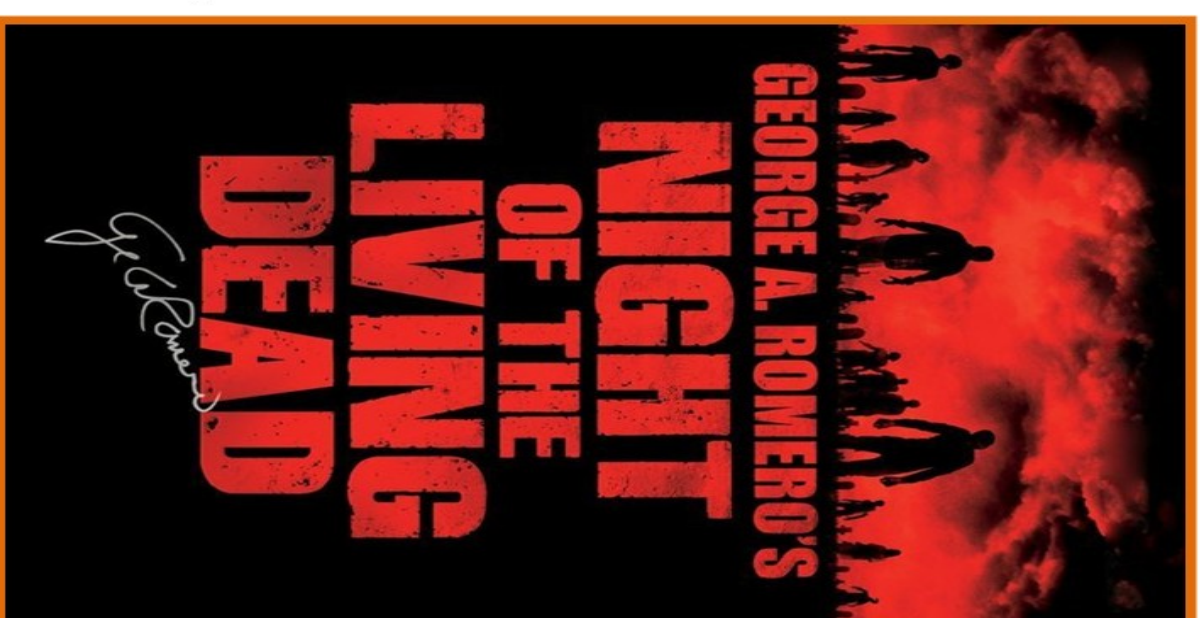

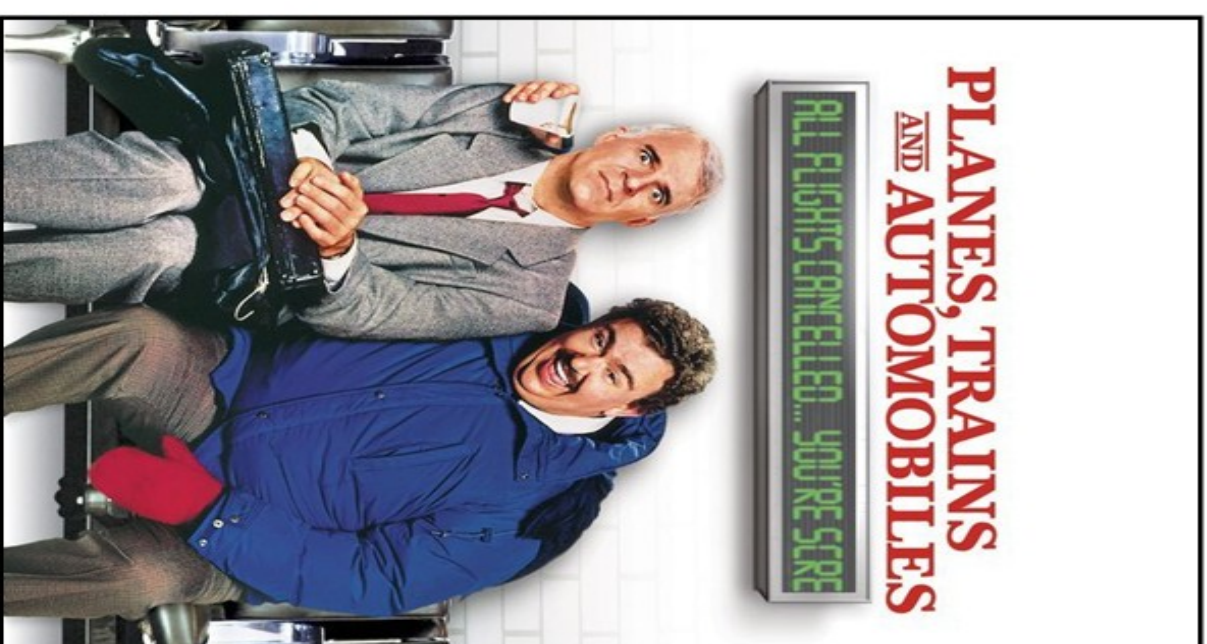

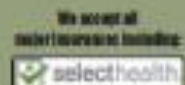
