Reasons why I want to be your Mayor:

As a life-long resident of Eureka, I feel I have the insight to help Eureka overcome the problems it faces.

We have all seen the problems of erosion along our streets since the EPA did their work here. I'm currently working with FEMA and other federal agencies to mitigate the problems this has caused and implement a flood control infrastructure that will fix this. I am fairly certain that we will be able to obtain about \$2 million in Federal money for this project, no cost to local residents.

In the 1930's, the Civilian Conservation Corp ran rock and concrete ditches throughout town to handle run off water, these ditches have mostly disappeared and the water is damaging roads and homes because it has no planned control. It needs to be fixed soon.

Our schools are dependent on out of district students to keep them going. I think we need some common-sense growth to help maintain enough students so that our school district is not swallowed up by either Nebo or Juab. We need these schools to be successful. This means we may need to annex some of the surrounding area to allow for growth since there are very few parcels of land available that are large enough to accommodate a home with the required set-backs.

We need to attract jobs. Most of our kids leave Eureka in order find a job and raise a family. They need the option of staying in the town where they grew up if they want. I meet with the county economic director often and we are working to get some good paying jobs in Eureka.

We need to preserve our history while working towards a sustainable future.
